## What does the VEC do?

The Victorian Electoral Commission:

- Organises the State and local council elections.
- Is independent of political parties and is always impartial.
- Looks after the electoral roll.



## Voting is....

- being heard on issues that are important
- everyone's human right
- the responsibility of every eligible Australian citizen
- about expressing choice as to who is the best person to represent 'me' in the parliament
- about being part of the decision-making process.


## The State election on 26 November decides who will be in government in Victoria



In the 2022 State election, you will be voting for candidates to represent you in the Parliament of Victoria.

## To vote in the state election you will:

Get two separate ballot papers


A ballot paper for the
Legislative Assembly
(Lower House)

## You must vote on each ballot paper.

## How do I vote for the Legislative Assembly?

```
Ballot Paper
district of
District Name
Number the boxes \(\mathbf{1}\) to 8
in the order of your choice.
```

- Write the number ' 1 ' next to the person you would most like to win the election.
- Number every other box in order of who you next most want to win.
- Every box needs to be numbered for your vote to be counted.
- Use each number only once.
- Do not use ticks or crosses.


## How do I vote for the Legislative Council?

## Option 1 - Above the line



## How do I vote for Legislative Council? continued...

## Option 2 - Below the line



- Number at least 5 boxes below the line in order of the candidates you most want to win.
- You must number at least 5 boxes for your vote to be counted.
- You can number more than 5 boxes.


## Help with voting

- You can ask for help or bring someone to help you.
- Check voting centre access at www.vec.vic.gov.au or Election Guide
- All early voting centres will have a hearing loop.
- Translated voting instructions on the back of voting screens.
- Braille ballot papers can be ordered from the VEC ahead of the election.
- Ask for a magnifying sheet and a maxi pencil at the voting centre when you vote.


## Help with voting continued...

- If you make a mistake on a ballot paper at a voting centre, ask one of our staff for help.
- Take your time, there is no hurry.



## State elections are attendance elections

Voters can cast their vote at any voting centre in Victoria on election day (26 November 2022).

There are also options for:

- early voting
- postal voting
- overseas and interstate voting.



## What to do if you are away during the election

## You can still vote <br> Vote early (14-25 Nov) <br> Tell us you are away: complete Away from Victoria form



Apply for an online postal vote
If interstate: vote in person at any electoral commission head office

If overseas: vote in person at selected Australian embassies

- If these are not possible or you choose not to vote, keep your travel ticket.
- After the election, you might get a letter from us. Reply to the letter explaining you were out of Victoria and attach your travel ticket as proof.
