## Course Outline

This course provides a comprehensive training program to meet the needs of the Children's Services industry. Students will be equipped with the skills and knowledge for a challenging career with young children aged from 0-6 years.

## Vocational Outcomes

Students may continue their educational pathway to CHC50121 Diploma of Early Childhood Education and Care.

Students who complete this course may look for a job such as: Early Childhood Educator, Outside school hours care assistant, Playgroup Supervisor, Family Day care Worker, or Nanny.

## Entry Requirements

There are no formal entry requirements to this program. You will be required to successfully complete an ACSF language, literacy and numeracy (LLN) assessment. A clear Police Record Check with no disclosures and a Working with Children Check are mandatory for practical placement.

## Duration & Delivery Methods

43 weeks including some school break weeks (Course duration may vary, depending on previous education and delivery hours).

This course consists of 17 units of study: 15 core units and 2 electives units.

Classroom based delivery (14 hours/week) with required 160-hour practical placement in an accredited childcare centre. Placement services are provided by

Students must successfully complete all workplace assessments and in-class assessments to be deemed competent for any unit.
